a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

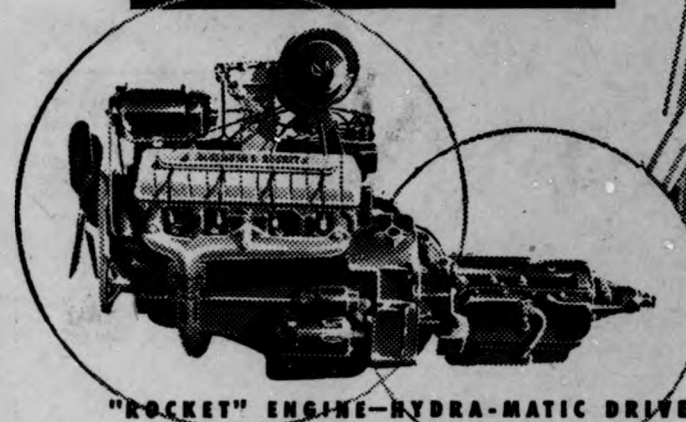
