

**UNITED CONFEDERATE VETERANS.**

Headquarters South Carolina Division, CHARLESTON, S. C. Nov. 25, '96. GENERAL ORDER No. 26.

I. The Division Commander being convinced that certain suggested changes not in conflict with our Constitution, would materially improve the condition of the U. C. V. in this State, to secure a general expression of opinion thereon, invited a representative from each Camp, the Brigade Commanders and the Division Staff to meet him at the Fair Grounds in Columbia, November 11. The plan with certain modifications, met the unanimous approval of all present at that meeting. The Division Commander therefore promulgates the scheme, and commends it most earnestly to the Division as one calculated to largely increase the interest in and increase the membership in and influence of, the U. C. V. of this Division.

II. The formation of the small Camps, by country neighborhoods is deemed preferable to large Camps, embracing an entire county or other large areas. Such offers opportunities for more frequent meetings and intercourse, and thus keeps alive an interest in our organization and our opportunities for good. The organization of the Camps of each County into Regiments, which can meet at least annually, supplies the place of a County Camp.

III. Camps can be formed in sparsely settled neighborhoods with a minimum of 10 members, but at least 20 members in the preferable number for a Camp. The expenses attending a Camp are \$3 charter fee paid only on applying for the charter, 15 cents per member per annum, (10 cents to General Federation U. C. V. and 5 cents to State Division.) These fees should be remitted to Col. JAMES G. HOLMES, Adjutant-General, Charleston, S. C.

IV. The Camps in each County of this State in which there are three or more Camps, will be formed into Regiments. Each Regiment will be known by the name of its County.

V. The following Counties having the requisite number of Camps the Regiments are hereby formed as follows: Abbeville Regiment, Aiken Regiment, Anderson Regiment, Barnwell Regiment, Charleston Regiment, Colleton Regiment, Edgefield Regiment, Florence Regiment, Greenville Regiment, Orangeburg Regiment, Spartanburg Regiment, York Regiment.

VI. Other Regiments will be organized as soon as three camps are formed in the respective Counties.

VII. Each Regiment will elect one of its members Commander, ranking as Colonel, who shall appoint an Adjutant to hold office concurrent with him. These officers are charged with looking after the general interests of the U. C. V. in their respective Counties.

VIII. The Commander of the Senior Camp in each County is charged with the duty of calling a meeting of the representatives of the Camps in his County, which representatives deciding on the method of the first election will elect the Col. and report to these headquarters. It is desirable to effect this organization before January 15, 1897.

IX. Each Regiment will hold at least one meeting in each year at such time or times as its members may decide.

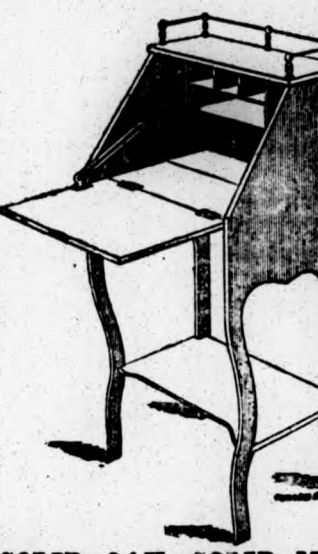

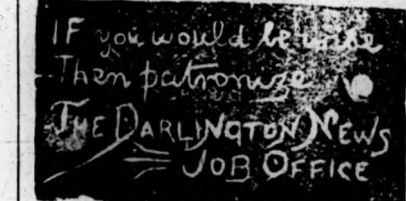
