

The Legal Tender Act and the Resumption of Specie Payment.

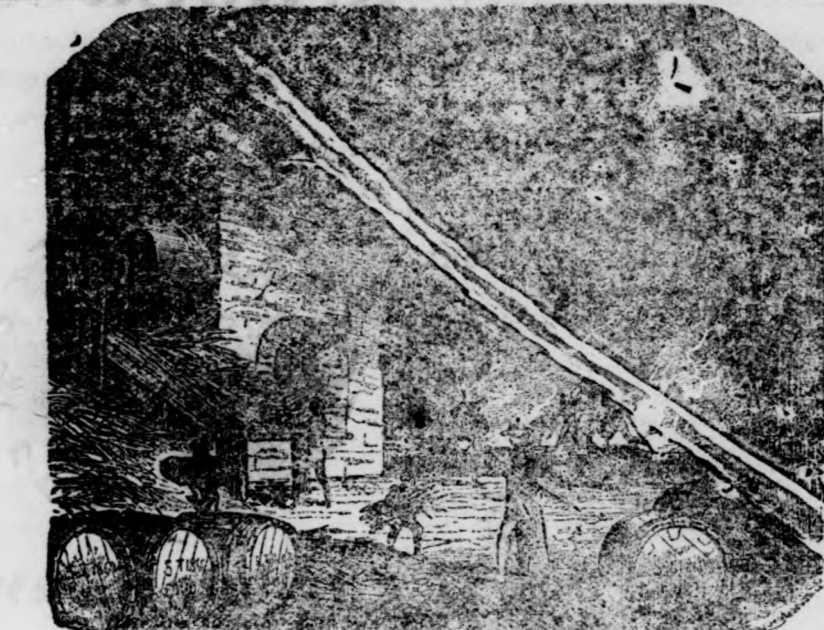

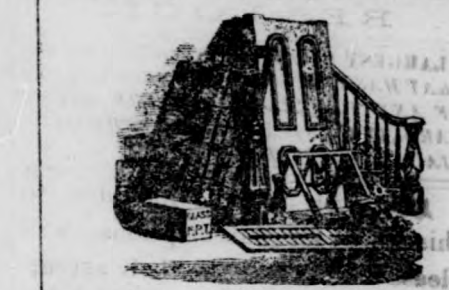
