Triumph of Whittemore.

TRIAL JUSTICES.

THEIR APPOINTMENT UNCONSTITUTIONAL. An Important Decision.

The following decision has been made by his Honor Judge Green: THE STATE EX REL. HUDSON VS. MUDKAI--PROHIBITION.

An application for prohibition was made in the case to restrain the sheriff from executing a judgment rendered against the relator for the sum of eighty-three dollars.

The application was based upon the ground that the act of Assembly authorizing the appointment of magistrates with jurisdiction, such as given by that act, is in violation of the constitution of this State.

The first section of article 4th provides: "The judicial power of this State shall be vested in a Supreme Court; in two Circuit Courts, to wit: a Court of Common Pleas, having civil jurisdiction; and a Court of General Sessions, with criminal jurisdiction only in Probate Courts, and in Justices of the Peace."

The 22d section of article 4th defines the jurisdiction of justice: "Justices of the peace or two or more of them jointly, as the General Assembly may direct, have original jurisdiction in cases of bastardy, and in all matters of contract and actions for the recovery of fines and forfeitures, where the amount claimed does not exceed one hundred dollars, and such jurisdiction as may be provided by law in actions ex delicto, where the damages claimed do not exceed one hundred dollars, and prosecutions for assault, and so forth."

If we recur to the legislative act in question it will be found that the jurisdiction conferred upon the magistrates is precisely that given by the constitution to justices of the peace, except the amount named in the act is ninety-nine dollars instead of one hundred, and that the court established by that act is a substitute for that provided by the constitution.

It is constitutional for the Legislature to make this substitution? Can that body so change the organic law of the land? In my opinion they cannot, and the act by which the attempt has been made is a plain violation of the constitution.

It follows that the magistrate had not jurisdiction in this case, and the sheriff and officers acting under or by virtue of his authority are hereby restrained from executing the said judgment into execution.
