ORANGEBURG FAIR.
 The election is over and a glorious political victory has been won. Orangeburg County is redeemed and every community within our bounds feels more hopeful of the future than ever before. What more fitting occasion is there of manifesting our joy for recent successes than that of the approaching Fair, where visitors from every section of the State and every corner of the County will assemble to tell what they know and to hear what others know about the great victory. It is the duty of every citizen to put forth his best efforts to make this fair the crowning success of the day. In order to do this it is necessary for every farmer to bring samples of his crops and place them on exhibition, that visitors may see upon what a firm foundation the hope of our people is based; for the mechanic to bring the workmanship of his hands as a tribute to the grand success—nothing presents the prosperity of a community in a more favorable light than the machinery in daily use; for the Grangers, as a body, to crowd the building with the products of the farm and garden, and thus set forth the advantages of their co-operative system—nothing can give greater vitality to the fair than such a procedure; for the merchants to make the Fair tables show stands for their goods and wares, and thus show to the farmers and mechanics that their efforts are all in the direction of the general prosperity—no better advertisement can be had; for the professional men to lay upon the common after side by side with the farmer and mechanic, the purest drugs of the physician and the best title deeds of the lawyer—there is a peculiar fitness in this; and for the ladies, who are always the first to cheer man and the last to abandon him, to bring forth the royal robes and the dainty dishes to show the stronger sex for what the products of their farms might be applied and utilized by the true Carolina woman. For the lovers of fun a special committee has been appointed whose duty it will be to provide amusements for the occasion. Feasible among these will be the Tournament to be conducted by Capt. Hayden with 15 or 20 Knights in the characteristic and historic red of South Carolina; a band which will dispense sweet music during the entire period of the Fair; and on Thursday night a hop for the young people who may choose to trip on "the light, fantastic toe."

Surely after the glorious events of the last few weeks we should be willing to spend a little time and money for the success of such a social pathing, and compare the products of our labor during the present year with those of the last, and to bid each other God-speed in our efforts to build up the material prosperity of Orangeburg County. Let us, therefore, see to it that the 20th, 21st and 22d of November shall by notable days in the history of our town and County.
