Shall francance Companies be Required to Person Their Contracts

In some of the Southern States laws have been enacted which require insurance companies to comply with their contracts in compelling them to pay in case of loss by fire, the full amount upon which they receive premiums. Such a law is greatly needed in South Carolina. We are unable to see the justice in allowing companies to receive premiums on large insurances against them, and in case of loss pay a sum much smaller than that upon which they have received a premium. A law of this kind would save our citizens from loss in that they would get whatever they had expected, or it would have the effect o" preventing an over insurance and thus taking wrongfully from the insured premiums which will never be paid. The demand for a law for protection in this source is great, and any member who would secure the pass age of such a law would be entitled to the thanks of the State. - Press and Banner.




