The primary election comes off next Tuesday and the responsibility of selecting men to fill the several State offices, our county offices, and to represent Williamsburk county in the legislature conscientiously, fearlessly and ef ficiently is shared by every Democratic voter in the county. Commensurate with the privilege of voting is its responsibility. In government the people are soverign and if the wrong man is lected to fill any office they are blame. Hence it becomes the ty of every man in the county joying the privilege to .exercise e right of suffrage in the com z primary, to repair to his acstomed place of voting on next nesday and cast his ballot for ich men as he thinks are best ualified to fill the several offices, from that of Governor down to the least important in the county. Let there be a full vote in this county on next Tuesday and may such men be chosen as their election will redound to the dignity, honor and welfare of our State and county.

IN SPITE OF HAND THES.

A protocol, that is, a preliminary treaty of peace, has been agreed to and signed by the chited States and Spain. The following are the articles agreed upon: Article 1. Spain will renounce all claim to all sovereignty over and all her rights over the island of Cuba.

The Article of Peace

Article 2 Spain will ecde to the United States the island of Porto Rico and the other islands which are at present under the sovereign-25 ty of Spain in the Antilles, as well as an island in Ladrone Archipelago, to be chosen by the United States.

Article 3. The United States will occupy and retain the city and bay of Manilla and the port of Manila, pending the conclusion of a treaty of peace, which shall determine the control and form of government of the Philippines. Article 4. Spain will immediately evacuate Cuba, Porto Rico and the other islands under Spanish sec. sovereignty in the Antilles. To this effect each of the two governments will appoint commissioners within ten days after the signing of this protocol, and these commissioners shall meet at Havana within thirty days after the signing of this proctocol, with the object of coming to an agreement regarding the carrying out of the our county, State and National details of the aforesaid evacuation of Cuba and other adjacent Span ish islands; and each of the two governments shall likewise appoint within ten days after the signature of this proctocol other commissioners, who shall meet at San Juan de Porto Rico within thirty days after the signature of this proctocol, to agree upon the details of the evacuation of Porto Rico and other islands now under Spanish sovereignty in the Antills. Article 5. Spain and the United States shall appoint. to treat Sr peace, five commissioners s the most for either country. The commissioners shall mee in Paris on October 1, at theatest, to proceed to negotiatios and to the conclusion of , treaty of peace. This treat shall be ratified in conformy with the constitutional law of






