Notice is hereby given that an elecsion will be held at the several precinets established by law in Williamsburg county on

Pursuant to the Constitution of South Carolina, and the terms of Joint Resolutions No. 310 and 341, approved February 19th. 1900. [Acts of South Carolina, pp. 570 and 571], an election will also be held at the same time and place for emendments to the Constitu-tion of South Carolina, as follows:

Amend Section 7, of Article VIII, of the Constitution of South Carolina. as follows: Add at the end thereof the following words: "Provided, that the limitation imposed by this Section and by Section 5, Article IV, of this Constitution shall not apply to bonded indebtedness incurred by the cities of Columbia, Rock Hill, Charleston and Florence, where the proceeds of said bonds are applied solely for the parchase establishment, maintenance or increase of water works plant, sewer-age system, gas and electric light plants, where the entire revenue arismg from the operation of such plants or systems, shall be devoted solely and exclusively to the maintenance and Goardins, operation of the same, and where the question of incurring such indebtedness is submitted to the freeholders. Cades, and qualified voters of such municipal- | Cedar Swamp, ity, as provided in the Constitution, upon the question of other bonded in-debtedness."

Amend the Constitution of South Carolina by adding thereto the follow-lowing to be known as "Article I of Amendments to the Constitution:" The General Assembly shall provide by law for the condemnation, through proper official channels, of all lands necessary for the proper drainage of the swamp and low lands of this State; and shall also provide for the equita-ble assessment of all lands so drained, for the purpose of paying the expenses of such condemnation and drainage.'

The said Amendments shall be sub-

The said Amendments shall be submitted in such manner that the electors qualified to vote for members of the House of Representatives shall vote for or against each of such amendments separately.

Amendments should be on separate tickets. Ballots in favor of the adoption of an amendment should contain the amendment voted upon in full. followed by the word "Yes;" ballots opposed to the adoption of an amendment should contain the amendment voted upon in full. voted upon, followed by the word


