The trial of John Livingston, the negro who assaulted the daughter of the keeper of the national cemetery, near Florence, last fall took place Tuesday before Judge Watts. The affair excited great indignation at the time and Livingston was placed in the penitentiary at Columbia for safe-keeping.

The whole trial consumed only 20 minutes.
