Lake City, February 12, 1991 .-Chief Justice Mckver on Tuesday granted a rule to show cause and temporary injunction against the county board of control and Messrs. M. M. Rodgers and P. A. Parker, dispensers for Lake City and Scranton respectively, restraining them from taking any further steps toward opening dispensaries at the towns named, and from selling or causing to be sold any liquors at such places under the dispensary law.
