

In connection with the czar's well known enthusiasm for collecting pictorial post cards a pretty story is told. On the occasion of his last birthday a little English girl sent Nicholas II a picture post-card, wishing his majesty many happy returns of the day, at the same time asking him to be so kind and gracious as send her a Russian card in return. The czar was delighted, and promptly dispatched a very beautiful post-card to his juvenile correspondent, bearing his autograph, as well as that of the czarina.

During the progress of the present restoration of St. Patrick's cathedral of Dublin, the remarkable discovery was made that underneath the plaster of the time of William and Mary, real and beautiful 13th century stone had lain hidden for generations. Besides the gift of the new organ Lord Iveagh has caused it to be moved from the north transept to a fine organ chamber, reached by a beautiful spiral staircase of stone copied from one in Mayence cathedral.

In the Philippines beef is 60 cents a pound, mutton 45, pork 60, veal 60, halibut 60, blue cod 55, salmon 60, pigeons \$2 apiece, beef tongues \$2 50, geese 3 50 apiece, wild ducks \$1.75 and tame ducks \$2 25 apiece. The meats are all Australian frozen. Butter is \$1 a pound and milk is \$4.50 a gallon.

The office of the Supervisors of Registration will be opened on the first Monday in every month for the purpose of the registering of any person who is qualified as follows:

Who shall have been a resident of the State for two years, and of the county one year, and of the polling precinct in which the elector offers to vote four months before the day of election, and shall have paid, six months before, any poll tax then due and payable, and who can both read and write any section of the constitution of 1895 submitted to him by the Supervisors of Registration, or who can show that he owns, and has paid all taxes collectable on, during the present year, property in this State assessed at three hundred dollars or more.

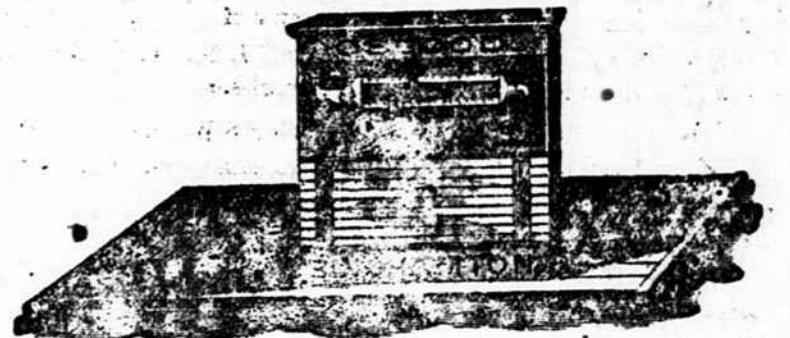
