To Our Subscribers.

We have patiently waited upon a number of our subscribers during the dull season, and it has been done cheerfully. Now that cotton is coming in we hope that they will kindly remember us. Already some have called and moved up their figures to the right point. Let there be a general movement in this direction, and it will be greatly appreciated. We feel that we shall have a cheerful and ready response to this request.

Needed - A New School Building.

The greatest improvements in school-building in this State have wrought within the last ten years. The great majority of tax-payers, who comprise the major part of the parents, are beginning to realize that comfort, neatness and beauty should be inherent qualities of the building wherein children spend at least half of the day. We noticed a few days ago in a news-letter from Branchville that that town had outdone itself in recently having finished a new \$5000 school building. Kingstree at present is very well equipped in some of the rooms of its school-building, but no one denies that the children and teachers have not comfortable space—enough room to keep from crowding each other in passing about in the school-room. It is now up to our people to devise some means whereby we can build a new school-building.

In our present building we have no assembly hall at all, and the superintendent and children under other teachers do not come together a single time during the day's work, except during the visits of the former to the various rooms. Hence he is deprived of that necessary requisite to proper management and discipline—contact at least once each day with the children from all the rooms.

We do not doubt that all are ready to admit the need of a better building, the question of how to get it confronts us. This we want to be earnestly and carefully considered by every thinking and interested citizen. Let us get together then and say, not whether we shall have a new building, but how are we to get it, and get it at once. Many smaller and younger towns, towns that pay less taxes and do not bear the dignity of being called county-seats, have outstripped us in that respect, and are now drawing patronage from outlying points. Our town is logically the place for a central high-school for the boys and girls of Williamsburg who are in such sparsely settled localities as to miss the advantages of good and long term schools, and many and many a child can thus be at-

tract to our school, if we but obliterate the existing disadvantage our school suffers in its building being too small.
