They wish to make this a "home enterprise" and would prefer to place every dollar of the stock in Williamsburg county. When the stock begins to pay handsome dividends, as there is every reason to believe it will, every dollar of profit should remain at home, and to this end everybody who has money to spare, be it much or little, is invited to get in on the ground floor.

AN IMPORTANT MEETING.

Committee Appointed to Select Oil Mill Site and Purchase Machinery.

A meeting of subscribers to stock in the Kingstree oil mill was held at the Bank of Kingstree on Saturday, the 7th inst. Dr D C Scott was called to the chair and C E St-Amand, Esq., chosen secretary. The object of the meeting as stated by the chair was to appoint a committee to procure a charter, to inspect oil mill plants in operation and to take such further steps as are necessary to act intelligently in purchasing and equipping the machinery for a plant of the proper size and capacity, including the seleotion of a suitable site for the location of the mlll.

On motion of Mr LeRoy Lee the following committee was chosen for the purpose above stated with plenary power to take any action they deem advisable looking to the early establishment of the plant: Messrs J F Cooper, D C Scott, John A Kelley and R H Kellehan.

Immediately following the adournment of the stock-holders' neeting the special committee went nto executive session. Mr James F Cooper was elected chairman of this Saturday, February 28, at 3 o'clock committee. A motion was made and p. m., in the McDaniel burying carried that the chairman make an ground. immediate call for 25 per cent of all stock subscribed.

Another veteran has gone to his reward in the death of Mr Leonard Dosier Baxley, which sad event took place on Friday, February 27, 1903. Mr Baxley was 73 years old in January. At the outbreak of the war he entered the Confederate army along with one brother and two half-brothers. His brother died in Richmond, Va., from a wound received in service, and one of his half-brothers also died from the effect of a wound inflicted in battle. The other half--brother survived a wound and went to Georgia after the war, where he was employed in Rockdale Paper Mills, Conway. Ga., until his death some years ago.

Mr L D Baxley was sick for some months and suffered a great deal, but he bore his affliction with the fortitude characteristic of a true soldier and when the final summons came he met the last enemy, death, with calm and unfaltering courage.






