TRANSFERRED TO THIS COUNTY.

Two Jail Birds Gained with Newly Acquired Territory.

The two negroes John Richardson and George Williams, who on July 12 broke into Mr Winslow Wright's store at Seranton and with guns stolen therefrom went on up to Cowards and assaulted a white man for which they were arrested and lodged in the Florence jail, have been transferred to the Williamsburg county jail. This is the result of the recent survey which placed Cowards in Williamsburg instead of in Florence county. The crimes were committed between Seranton and Cowards, all of which is now Williamsburg territory.

John Richardson, one the criminals, is totally blind, his eyes having been shot out at the time he was captured.
