"The free public schools of the State shall observe the third Friday of November of each year as arbor day." Such is the substance of the act of the Legislature passed in 1898, but not generally observed although its terms are mandatory. Hon O B Martin, the State superintendent of education, is taking a great deal of p interest in the matter of having the day celebrated properly by the schobls of the State, and is circulating the programme for such occasion prepared byz Miss Mary E. 
