The Lake City Lodge Knights of Pythias has purchased a nice lot on Main street just below the dwelling house of Mr J D Daniel. On this lot the Lodge will build at once, so we are informed, a two storied brick house, the lower story of which will be fitted up for a store and the upper for the lodge room. The Knights have long felt their need of a suitable home for their order and have determined to be wanting no longer. Hence this move. It is probable that the Masons will secure the use of the hall for their quarters also.

Sheriff Burch came down Sunday and carried the prisoner to Florence Sunday night. Singletary had been in hiding since the crime was committed and felt that he could come here in safety, but found this a mistake.

There was quite a crowd in town Saturday and some of the crowd, after "crowding down" more of that which is dispensed from the State's whiskey shop than they could contain without losing their equanimity and equilibrium, proceeded to dispense much noise, reckless driving and large "cuss words". Two white men were salted down in the refrigerator and allowed to cool off. Another, who was pretty full, managed to keep from being "pulled" and got out of town, but when a few miles away the liquor could no longer resist the temptation to get him in trouble, and he tried to empty a load of shot into another man, who fortunately knocked the barrel of the gun aside just as it was discharged. Had not this second man been cool, and collected, it is probable that we would be called upon to chronicle a horrible homicide instead of an assault.

**Registration Notice.**

The office of the Supervisors of Registration will be opened on the first Monday in every month for the purpose of the registering of any person who is qualified as follows: Who shall have been a resident on the State for two years, and of the county one year, and of the polling precinct in which the elector offers to vote four months before the day of election, and shall have paid, six months before, any poll tax then due and payable, and who can both read and write any section of the constitution of 1895 submitted to him by the Supervisors of Registration, or who can show that he owns, and has paid all taxes collectable on during the present year, property in this State assessed at three hundred dollars or more.
