LAKE CITY LOCAL NEWS.

Disastrous Fire at Leo—Various Items of Interest.

LAKE CITY, October 24.—The frosts Saturday, Sunday and Monday nights ran the news thermometer down almost to the freezing point.

The lumbering and ginning plant of Messrs Brown Brothers at Leo was destroyed by fire last Friday morning. The plant consisted of a large steam saw mill, gin, grist mill and shingle mill. At nightfall on Thursday the mill was shut down, the fires were put out carefully, as usual, and everything closed up for the night. About 3 o'clock next morning the fire was discovered but all efforts failed to extinguish the flames or even check their progress. Everything except a few pieces of lumber,

which were pulled away, was destroyed. Thirty bales of cotton in the yard were burned up, also a lot of seed. All of the cotton except three bales belonged to these gentlemen. The loss is about \$5,000, certainly not less than \$4,000 at the lowest, and not a cent of insurance. The loss is a serious blow to Messrs Brown Bros, who had to stand by and see many days' hard honest toil go up in smoke. It is thought that the fire was the work of an incendiary, but for good and obvious reasons his name and grounds of suspicion are withheld.

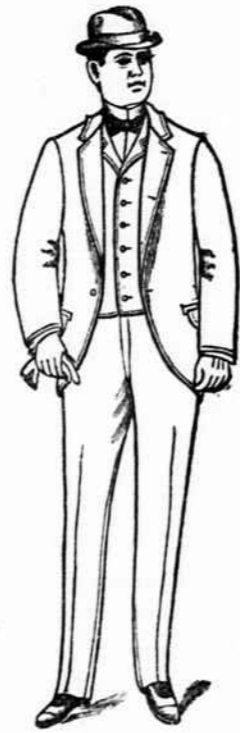
