MR. GORDON STILL NOT CONVINCED.

CATECHISES MR. GAUSE AND INTERPOLATES THE USUAL DISPENSARY "LOGIC."

Editor County Record:

I wish to ask Mr. Gause some questions, but before doing so I wish to call your attention to a short editorial in your paper of August 31, 1905:

"To those who claim that the dispensary is the back-bone of our educational system we would cite the fact that in Greenwood county the average public school term is as long or longer than in Williamsburg, the teachers receive more pay and yet the taxes are no higher than ours. How are we going to get around these facts?"

I wish to give the number of schools in each county, the revenue of each county for schools, which will explain it all:

No. schools in Greenwood Co.—white 53, negro 62. Total 115.

No. schools in Williamsburg Co.—white 102, negro 78. Total 180.

I will give the revenue from each county for schools:

Williamsburg has 65 more schools than Greenwood county; Greenwood has \$12,194.84 the most money.

Now I will take up Mr. Gause's sermon and will say to him, don't make any excuses to the editor for bothering him. The editor has given the people the use of the columns of his paper to discuss the dispensary question and has been publishing his (Mr. Gause's) sermons over and over, just whenever he wanted it done. It was the same sermon every time and I am satisfied that the editor will publish all that either side has to say, if it is worth publishing. The readers of THE RECORD have that sermon by heart, as well as his church-members. I would imagine they can repeat it by heart, so give us something new.

I want Mr. Gause to answer these questions. He can put the number of each question to his answer. Don't skip any. If you can't answer, say so.

1. The man that the dispenser in Kingstree was telling about who bought so much whiskey and shipped it to Lake City, what would prevent that man from buying that whiskey outside of the State and having it shipped to him if there were no dispensary in the State?

2. Which would be the best for that man to do, buy his whiskey outside of the State and sell it here and let the county lose the profits, or buy it here and let the county have the benefit of the profits?

3. What good did prohibition do when we had it?

4. Which will be the easiest for blind tigers, with no constables to watch them and seize their whiskey or have constables watching them and seizing their whiskey? Remember did we not have these constables before we had the dispensary law and the State could not keep them without taxing the people to do it and you would soon be howling about that as you are now about the whiskey. The prohibition party hates the constables as bad as they do the dispensary.

5. Which would be the most favorable for blind tigers to make sales, to have the dispensary to compete with or to have no competition?

6. Can the legislature make any law that will prohibit railroads and express companies from bringing whiskey within the State? If so tell us how they can do it.

7. We have in this part of the county (and, I suppose, all over the county) men that are making whiskey and selling it. I have put the question to some of them asking them how they were going to vote. They say they are going to vote for prohibition, that the dispensary is in their way. How does the dispensary get in their way?

8. I know a man that is doing all he can for prohibition and he gets drunk every chance he gets. I could not understand what he wanted until recently I found out he was selling whiskey. Why is that man working so hard for prohibition?

9. How will you feel when you know you are voting with these kind of people to get things in the shape they want it?

10. Can prohibition prohibit anyone that wants to buy whiskey from buying it?

11. Can it prohibit people from drinking whiskey when they have got it?

12. What good will prohibition do when we get it? Does it prohibit?

13. Can prohibition prohibit people from making whiskey?

Before I close I will say that Greenwood county pays \$12,931.75 more money from the three mill and extra levy tax and gets their share of the dispensary money from the State and with 65 less schools than Williamsburg.

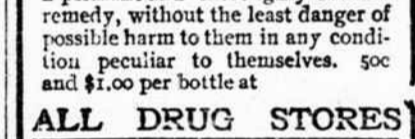
