THE FARMERS' INSTITUTE.
A Bad Day and a Small Crowd—The Extension Work Car.

The special car for the extension work of Clemson College arrived here Thursday, the day appointed for holding the farmers' institute in the court house. The day was very raw and inclement and only about thirty people gathered to hear the lectures, but the handful that braved the weather seemed to find the talks very interesting and instructive, and stayed in their seats throughout the session.

The institute was conducted by Director Harper and four assistant Profs. Morrison, Daggett, Newman and Garrison.

A cordial invitation was extended to the people generally to visit the car which contains "as much as possible of Clemson College." Many availed themselves of the privilege. All the afternoon the car was filled with interested visitors.

Probably the most interesting exhibit to farmers was that of the Charleston county experiment station of Clemson College, which shows what can be done with alfalfa. This exhibit is in charge of Mr. W. D. Garrison, who is a graduate of Clemson and has charge of the station. Mr. Garrison is very enthusiastic in his work and never tires explaining the merits of alfalfa as an article of stock food.

The textile department, in charge of Prof. C. S. Daggett, is also most interesting, especially to the ladies. In this department is shown how patterns for cloth are made and how cotton is mercerized, how plush is made, and all sorts of figured goods. This department has not only been of great benefit to the students that have graduated from it, but it has been of great benefit to the mills of the State and to the State directly and indirectly.

Prof. C. C. Newman has a most interesting exhibit of horticulture and can interest both ladies and gentlemen in his talks on the exhibits.

There are also exhibits of geology and biology and all kinds of things that the farmer ought to be interested in. The mechanical department is well represented in the work of students.

The car is in charge of Prof. Harper, of the agricultural department, and with them is Prof. Morrison who tells you about technical

education generally, and you cannot fail to be interested in the car.

The extension work car went from here to Lake City to hold an institute Friday.
