The office of the Supervisor of Registration will be opened on the first Monday in every month for the purpose of the registering of any person who is qualified as follows:

Who shall have been a resident of the State for two years, and of the county one year, and of the polling precinct in which the elector offers to vote four months before the day of election, and shall have paid, six months before, any poll tax then due and payable, and who can both read and write any section of the constitution of 1895 submitted to him by the Supervisors of Registration, or who can show that he owns, and has paid all taxes collectable on during the present year, property in this State assessed at three hundred dollars or more.

### Want More Cotton to Gin.

We continue to do all we say we are doing, viz, ginning all the cotton that is brought us without any one having to wait very long. In fact it now looks that we cannot be crowded any day, turning out the short staple in as short time as ten to twelve minutes.

While the price of seed is somewhat off, yet we are paying more than the present conditions will warrant for all the seed accessible, that we might control the situation here among you, a home corporation doing business at home for the interest at home.

To those who do not care to sell their seed for cash we are offering a strictly high grade meal in exchange. Our rate of exchange at the mill is 1500 lbs. of meal for one ton of seed. It is a conceded fact cotton seed meal is a cheaper and more effective fertilizer than cotton seed. According to chemical analysis of each 888 pounds of cotton seed meal are equivalent to 2000 pounds of cotton seed, but owing to the superior mechanical condition of meal, it is safe to assume that 800 pounds of meal are the full equivalent to one ton of cotton seed, therefore, whatever excess above 800 pounds of meal the farmer gets in exchange for a ton of seed is so much clear profit to him in comparison with using the ton of seed directly as a fertilizer.
