istration will be opened on the first
Monday in every month for the pur-
pose of the registering of any person
who is qualified as follows:
Who shall have been a resident of
the State for two years, and of the
county one year, and of the polling pre-
cinct in which the elector offers to
vote four months before the day of
election, and shall have paid, six
months before, any poll tax then due
and payable, and who can both read
and write any section of the constitu-
tion of 1895 submitted to him by the
Supervisors of Registration, or who
can show that he owns, and has paid
all taxes collectable on during the
present year, property in this State
assessed at three hundred dollars or

Want More Cotton to Gin.

On account of insufficient sup-
ply of cotton to keep us run-
ning every day, beginning next
week, we will confine ourselves
to gin days. These being Tues-
day, Wednesday, and Friday
of each week. The ginning pub-
lic will please govern themselves
accordingly.

While the price of seed is
somewhat off, yet we are pay-
ing more than the present con-
ditions will warrant for all the
seed accessible, that we might
control the situation here among

meal in exchange. Our rate of

ROOSEVELT TO THE RESCUE.

**Government Will Issue Bonds to Re-
lieve Financial Stringency.**

WASHINGTON, November 17:—
Secretary Cortelyou made to-night
the important announcement that
a means of affording relief to the
financial situation the Treasury would
issue \$30,000,000 of Panama bonds
and \$100,000,000 of certificates of
indebtedness, or so much thereof as
may be necessary. The certificates
will run for one year and bear 3 per
cent interest.

The Secretary's action in coming
to the relief of the financial situa-
tion meets with President Roose-
velt's hearty approval, and the plan
is the outcome of the several White
House conferences which have been
held within the past few days, when
the financial situation was under
consideration.

Secretary Cortelyou says that the
Panama bonds will afford most sub-
stantial relief, as the law provides
that they may be used as a basis for
additional national bank circulation.
He also states that the proceeds from
the sale of certificates can be made
directly available at points where
the need is most urgent and especial-
ly for the movement of the crops,
which, he says, "if properly accel-
erated, will give the greatest relief
and result in most immediate finan-
cial returns." The Secretary calls
attention to the attractiveness of
the bonds and certificates as abso-
lutely safe investments.

A Novel Spectacle.
