DEATH OF MR. W. S. MOORE.

Popular Young Tobacco Buyer Passes Away Suddenly.

LAKE CITY, December 3:—Mr. William S. Moore died at his home on Acline avenue on Wednesday night, the 27th instant, of a complication of liver, kidney and stomach troubles. He had been failing quite a while—in fact, he was in bad health when he moved here some eight years ago, but kept attending to his duties right regularly until only a short while ago.

When the Lake City tobacco market was opened Mr. Moore came here from South Boston, Va. as a buyer and becoming pleased with the town and the business decided to make his home with us. In 1904, he married Miss Hallie L. Rollins, the youngest daughter of the late Mr. R. D. Rollins. She survives him, as well as his mother, one brother and two sisters, who live at the old Virginia home, where his body was laid in its narrow bed on Friday. The remains were accompanied by Mrs. Moore and Messrs. H. V. Epps and J. C. McElveen.
