While the legislature is raising the salaries of some county officials why not raise them all? It looks like partiality to raise some and slight the others.

The salaries of the county auditor, the county treasurer and the supervisor will probably be raised in all the counties. These officials in Williamsburg will hereafter receive \$1,200, in lieu of \$900 each for auditor and treasurer and \$700 for the supervisor.

There is a bill pending in the legislature to relieve the State treasurer and certain ex-treasurers of liability for bonds stolen by their dishonest clerk, who was not under bond, thereby mulcting the State of some thousands of dollars. Is there any limit?

There is a plan on foot to remodel the State house. It is only a few years since many thousands of dollars were expended on this same work and after being completed the work was condemned. Something was said about suing the architect and contractors for the recovery of the State's money, but we have never heard of any money being recovered.

Another Junketing Tour.

"The special train provided by the Atlantic Coast Line for the use of the legislators consisted of five handsome new passenger coaches, in addition to the baggage car. There were two hundred and twenty-nine people on board the special. Of this number twenty-nine were ladies." Thus is described by the reporter of the News and Courier the vehicle and personnel of the most recent junketing tour of the honorable gentlemen of the general assembly. He also said that it was a jolly party, and no doubt it was, but the cost to the State was probably several thousands for the trip and of course after accepting the generous hospitality of the Citadel the Solons could not well refuse the modest little appropriation it asks. As will be seen in the appropriation bill, which we publish elsewhere, the Citadel wants this year \$62,750 as against \$35,750 last year.

No wonder the State tax levy will be increased to six mills.

An Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE LICENSES WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF KINGSTREE, S. C., FOR THE YEAR A. D. 1908.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kingstree, S. C., in Council assembled and by the authority of the same:

Section 1. That every person, firm or corporation engaged in or intending to engage in any trade, business, occupation or profession hereinafter mentioned, within the limits of the town of Kingstree, S. C., shall obtain, on or before the first day of February, A. D. 1908, a license therefor in the manner hereinafter prescribed.

Section 2. That every person, firm or corporation commencing business after the first day of February, A. D. 1908 shall in like manner obtain a license therefor before entering upon such trade, business, occupation or profession within the limits of the Town of Kingstree, S. C.

Section 3. That every person, firm or corporation required by this ordinance to obtain a license to engage in any trade, business, occupation or profession, for which a license is required, shall, at the time for applying for such license, make a statement and file the same with the Treasurer of the Town, setting forth (1) his, her or its name and style, and in case of a firm the names of the several persons, constituting such firm; (2) the trade, business, occupation or profession for which a license is required, and (3) the place where such trade, business, occupation is to be conducted or carried on.

Section 4. That the Clerk and Treasurer shall thereupon issue the proper license as provided for in this ordinance, the amount of said license having first been paid on or before the day named in the first section hereof. Provided, that nothing herein contained shall in any manner affect any other requirements of law elsewhere enacted in regard to any trade, business, occupation or profession.

Section 5. That if any person, firm or corporation shall carry on any trade, business, occupation or profession for which a license is required by this ordinance, without first obtaining and taking out a license as is hereby required, the said person, firm or corporation, shall be liable for the license required and in addition thereto shall be subject for each offence to a penalty of Fifteen per cent (15 per cent) of the amount of such license, which license and penalty shall be recovered as hereinafter provided; and if any person, firm or corporation shall refuse or neglect to make out and deliver to the Clerk and Treasurer, on or before the first day of February, A. D. 1908, a statement as above required, the Clerk and Treasurer shall proceed to ascertain as nearly as possible, the trade, business, occupation or profession of such person, firm or corporation, and from the information thus acquired, he shall proceed to issue the license required, to such person, firm or corporation, having first collected the amount of the license required together with the penalty of Fifteen per cent (15 per cent) of the said license as hereinbefore provided.

Section 6. That if the said license and the penalty shall not be paid within fifteen days, after the Clerk's ascertainment, the said Clerk and Treasurer shall issue his execution to the Town Policeman for the collection of the same, and the said Town Policeman shall proceed to collect said license and penalty by distress and sale, or by levy and sale in the manner as now provided by law for the collection of other taxes, together with five per cent (5 per cent) on the whole amount for which said execution is issued. Provided, that in lieu of the remedy herein given, suit may be brought in the name of the Town Council of Kingstree, S. C., in any court of competent jurisdiction for the recovery of the said license and the penalty thereon.

Section 7. That all licenses granted under this ordinance shall continue in force until December 31st, 1908; that the Clerk and Treasurer shall prepare a proper form to be issued in such cases, and that applications for licenses of all kinds shall be made to the Clerk and Treasurer.

Section 8. That the charge of license for any trade, business, occupation or profession not hereinbefore enumerated, shall be determined on by the Council at a meeting or meetings hereafter called for that purpose.

Section 9. That a Foot Tax of Two Dollars (\$2.00) be and the same is hereby assessed to be collected from each male inhabitant of the Town of Kingstree, S. C., subject under the Road Law to street duty, in lieu of doing work on the streets.

Section 10. That the following sums shall be paid to the Clerk and Treasurer, who on receipt thereof, shall issue therefor the proper license as hereinbefore provided for:

An Ordinance.

An Ordinance To Provide for an Annual License Tax on Dogs Within the Limits of the Town of Kingstree, S. C., and to Enforce the Collection of the Same.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Kingstree, S. C., in council assembled and by the authority of the same:

Section 1. That an annual License Tax of Fifty Cents (\$0.50) on every male dog, and an annual License Tax of One Dollar (\$1.00) on every female dog within the limits of the Town of Kingstree, S. C., to be paid by the owner or owners of the said male or female dog, is hereby assessed and imposed, which said License Tax shall be due and payable on or before the first day of February, A. D. 1908, and annually thereafter on the first day of each February.

Section 2. That upon the payment of said License Tax the owner or owners of each said dog shall, from the Clerk and Treasurer, receive a receipt therefor in proper form indicating the amount of the said License Tax, and the number of the dog for which said License Tax has been paid, and in addition to said receipt and at the same time, the Clerk and Treasurer shall, to the owner or owners of each said dog for which the License Tax herein described has been paid, deliver a metallic tag or badge indicating the year for which the License Tax has been paid, and the number of said dog according to the order of the payment of the said License Tax.

Section 3. That the metallic tag or badge so delivered to the owner of said dog, shall be attached to a collar and worn by the said dog for which the License Tax has been paid.

Section 4. Any dog found running at large on the streets of the Town of Kingstree, S. C., on and after the first day of March A. D. 1908, and not bearing the tag or badge indicating the year for which said license tax is due and payable shall be seized and impounded by the Policeman of said Town, who shall give immediate notice to the owner or owners of said dog of the seizing and impounding as herein required, and for every dog so seized and impounded, the owner or owners thereof shall be liable for the further sum of Fifty cents (\$.50,) in addition to the License tax. Provided that the owner or owners of any dog so seized and impounded, who has paid the License tax as herein required, may recover possession of said dog by presenting

Section 5. If the owner or owners of any dog or dogs seized and impounded as herein required, shall not, within forty eight hours after the notice of the seizing and impounding as herein required, have said dog or dogs in the manner hereinbefore prescribed, then in that event, the policeman seizing and impounding said dog shall kill and destroy the same without other and further notice to the owner or owners thereof.

Section 6. If after diligent inquiry, the policeman cannot ascertain the name of the owner of any dog so seized and impounded, he shall give notice by advertising in not less than three public and conspicuous places in said Town, for a period of not less than five days, of the seizing and impounding of said dog, at the expiration of which time he shall proceed to kill and destroy said dog, if the same shall not have been redeemed by the owner or owners thereof in the manner hereinbefore prescribed.

Section 7. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.
