In obedrence to the law requiring The salaries of auditors and treasur to the assessed values of propert and the service required, the pay of our auditor and treasurer bas been raised to $\$ 1,200$ along with an equal increase throughout the State. For the same reason jail fees have been cents.
Lisewise the salaries of all Stat ancers arem $\$ 3,000$ to $\$ 4,000$, and the other officers increased abont $\$ 400$ each: The Senate voted down bill to raise the per diem of legisla tors from $\$ 4.00$ to $\$ 5.00$
The levy for State taxes will more than exceed that of last year by a good deal, probably about one mill, which is a right big raise for a State for Williamsburg is very low-possibly one of the lowest in the State, $23-4$ mills. This is, of course, ex the $\$ 12000$ borrowed a year ago from the Sinking Fund commission to pay the debts of the "Roads and
Brilges Fand." Something like $\$ 4,000$ of this debt will be paid with in the next few days, we understand. The levy last year was $31-2$ mills This indicates that, so fas as our county is concerned, the extrava gance that prevails well nigh uni to lose their heads. Our count commissioners asked for only $\$ 12$, A little less than 234 mills would raise this very modest sum, but it was thought best to put the levy a 23.4 to allow for nulla bona execumizht happen at the most unexpect ed moment.
