County Candidates Elected.

Votes Counted and Result Declared by Executive Committee.

The County Democratic executive committee met Tuesday at 12 o'clock and canvassed the vote for county

and State offices. The following county candidates having received a majority vote were declared elected:

House of representatives, W D Bryan and J Davis Carter. For the third place, Messrs J S Graham and T B Gourdin, the two next highest, will go in the second primary.

J Wesley Cook is elected county treasurer.
J J Graham and S J Singletary will run over for road

engineer.
J N Hammet is elected county commissioner.
R K Gamble and W J Godwin will make the race in the second primary for coroner.
The unopposed candidates for sheriff, clerk of court, auditor, superintendent of education and probate judge were of course declared elected.
