Events of Current Interest Worthy of Mention.

The United States Court of Appeals sustained Judge Pritchard in his decision against the South Carolina commission for winding up the affairs of the late lamented State dispensary.

Gov Ansel has ordered a special term of the court general sessions of Saluda county for the trial of William Herrin, the negro who is charged with the murder of Emanuel Carver.

On Monday, September 14, Mr am Thompson, proprietor of a boarding house at Georgetown, committed suicide by shooting himself with a pistol. Melancholia brought about by financial troubles is thought to have been the cause.

A strange case of suicide took place recently in Lexington, where in John D Farr took his own life. Farr had been a candidate for county superintendent of education in the recent primary, and the surprising feature of the affair is that he was nominated by some 300 majority.

Gen M L Bonham, who was elected presidential elector of the Third District, has resigned as a notary public. He desires to be on the safe side and to avoid all suspicion of the violation of the constitution by holding more than one office at the same time.
