FRUITLESS SEARCH FOR MISSING WIFE.

Mrs. C. E. Brockington Mysteriously Disappears—Husband from This County.

The following "special" from Charleston to the Columbia State will interest many of the readers of THE RECORD, Mr Brockington being from this county:

Charleston, January 14:—After a fruitless search for his missing wife in Jacksonville, Mr C E Brockington of Charleston, a freight conductor on the Atlantic Coast Line railroad, has returned to Charleston, but not to give up his quest. He will give \$100 for information of the whereabouts of his wife, Mrs Emily Doty Brockington, and believing that she has gone to New York, will take steps to discover her there.

The last time that Mr Brockington saw his wife was on Wednesday afternoon, January 6, when he left her at their home, No 5 Charlotte street, with their 9 months-old girl, to take up his run to Savannah. Mrs Brockington the next day went to her mother's house at No 125 Calhoun street and left the baby, saying she was going to King street to shop. She has not been seen by any of her family since that time.

When Mr Brockington returned to his home he found it deserted and a letter, addressed to him from his wife, told him that she had gone away, but did not say where she had gone. Her reasons for doing this were not very clear, and Mr Brockington believes that her mind has been affected by ill health. In the letter, which was left at his home Mr Brockington read careful directions from his wife as the care of the baby. She advised him to place the child with the Church Orphanage Home.

With tears in his eyes, Mr Brockington declared this morning that he would give all his possessions to find his wife, and said that she would be gladly welcomed home should she be found. The baby is now with Mrs Brockington's mother, in Calhoun street.

Mr Brockington has had 1,500 circulars printed, giving a description and offering a reward for any information about his wife. She is five feet, five inches in height and has brown eyes and hair, weighs about 145 pounds, has a double chin. Her upper front teeth have gold fillings, which show. When she was last seen here she wore a blue skirt, a black cloak, a black silk waist and a hat trimmed with black ribbon.

Mr and Mrs Brockington have been married for several years, and have always lived most happily together. He has practically paid for a pretty home in Charlotte street, and said today that he was just beginning to get on his feet, with a good position, when this sad blow came. He has no other theory to advance than that his wife is suffering from mental weakness. Any information that may lead to discovering her whereabouts will be most joyfully received. Mr Brockington's present address is 125 Calhoun street.

LATER.

Mr Cosmo E Brockington, the Atlantic Coast Line freight conductor, who has been searching for his wife since January 7, stated this morning that she had been located, but he did not say where she was.

He was leaving the city when caught by telephone, and he declared that he had no time to explain the details, but wished the fact published that Mrs Brockington had been found.
