A PLAN TO BUILD AT ONCE THE CONFEDERATE MONUMENT AT ARLINGTON.

All who honor the courage and devotion of the Confederate soldier will please read:

Some years ago, under a generous act of the United States Congress, at government expense the remains Chairman of the Arlington Confedof 265 Confederate soldiers, then scattered throughout Arlington and MRS ARTHUR E JOHNSON, the District of Columbia, were gathared and interred together in a beautiful spot now known as the Confederate section in Arlington cemetery, ch grave marked with a marble parillas. Soon after the reinterment at Arigton, Confederate organizations in ashington began to move in this atter. In 1906 the United Daughes of the Confederacy, in convenation at Gulfport, endorsed the rement and subscribed to it. In 907 at Norfolk the daughters took all charge, appointing directors in eseveral States and an executive mmittee at Washington. All went omptly to work. From all sources amount received and deposited the American Security and Trust mpany of Washington, D C, as rerted at a meeting of our committee the 5th of April, 1909, was 999.73, besides \$4.50 on hand but yet deposited, aggregating over e thousand dollars now in hand. 
