STRICKEN DOWN WITHOUT WARNING.

Capt. S. M. Stoll Succumbs to Attack of Paralysis While Here on a Visit.

Died, on Sunday morning, May 16, about 5 o'clock at the home of P H Stoll, Esq, in Kingstree, Mr Samuel M Stoll, aged 46 years.

Mr Stoll, whose home was in Savannah, was on a visit to his brothers, Messrs P H and C W Stoll. He spent the day Friday out at the farm of Mr C W Stoll, in apparent good health, and was able to leave his room Saturday morning, although he was feeling very bad. About eleven o'clock he was stricken with paralysis — a light stroke — and about half past one o'clock he had another stroke and never regained consciousness, though everything possible was done for him. Dr McLeod of Florence was wired for and came down on the night train Saturday, but could do nothing more than had already been done.

The body was taken to the old home in Chester Sunday afternoon and the funeral services were held there Monday morning at 11 o'clock. Messrs C W and P H Stoll, Misses May and Sue Stoll and Messrs L J Stackley, R H Godwin, William Scott and Dr C D Jacobs accompanied the remains.

Mr Stoll was just entering into the zenith of his manhood and was one of the most trusted Pullman conductors on the Atlantic Coast Line railroad, in whose service he had been for any years.

He is survived by several brothers and sisters, viz: Messrs C W and P H Stoll of Kingstree, W M and Jas H Stoll of Chester and Misses May and Sue Stoll of Kingstree. He had never married.

This is the second time this family has been saddened by sudden deaths in the past few months, and the sympathy of the whole community goes out to the bereaved ones.
