### METHODISTS OF BENSON DEDICATE NEW CHURCH.

SERVICES CONDUCTED BY REV. W. A. FAIRY--SKETCH OF CEDAR SWAMP CHURCH.

(Received too late for last week's issue.)

Benson, August 3:—The Cedar Swamp Methodist church was erected on the same plot of ground that the present building now stands upon, about the year 1850. Dr Jno Williams, who is buried in the cemetery of the church, then a young man, took an active part in church affairs and during the strenuous 70's when money was scarce and labor at a premium he and Capt John E Scott, a zealous member of this denomination, undertook to build another church. The old building was of larger size and the preserved material was utilized and one of smaller size erected, Capt Scott doing the greater portion of the work himself—being a man who, as some of us well remember, was able to apply his willing hands to any task.

This building served the congregation until about the year 1895, when the officers with the concurrence of the congregation, seeing the necessity of another building, began work. They were also handicapped for lack of means. After several years of hard work and perseverance the church was completed. Last year it was nicely painted inside and outside and now stands free of all indebtedness, it being customary with the Methodists that the house used for the worship of God cannot be dedicated to His service until it is clear of all incumbrances.

On last Sunday Rev W A Fairy of Kingstree delivered in his usual eloquent style an intellectual dedicatory sermon, choosing his subject from John X:10.

The officers of the church, taking their places near the chancel, addressed the minister in the following language:

"We present to you this house, to be set apart from all unhallowed or common uses, for the worship of Almighty God."

The minister then pronounced the following sentence of dedication: "Forasmuch as God has put it into the hearts of His people to build this house for His worship, and has blessed them in their undertaking, we solemnly dedicate it to His service."

After the dedication protracted services were conducted by Revs J R Sojourner and W A Fairy.
