BOYS' CORN EXHIBIT NOVEMBER 12.

CONDITIONS OF CONTEST AND PRIZES OFFERED—EVERY BOY GETS A PRIZE.

Editor County Record:— Saturday, November 12, is the day appointed for the boys' corn exhibit at the court house in Kingstree and for the awarding of the different prizes. The basis on which the prizes will be awarded as follows:

Largest yield	30%
Best written account, showing history of crop and all expense	25 "
Best 10-ear exhibit	15 "
Best showing of profit on investment	30 "

A committee consisting of Mr H Eugene Montgomery, Prof J W Wittenberg and Mr T Olin Epps, will examine and grade the reports and on Saturday, November 12, will, after examining and grading the corn exhibits with the aid of an expert, declare the result, and prizes will be awarded accordingly.

Every member of the corn club must send in to me at once his blanks properly filled out and also a full history, written by himself, of his crop. Every boy should be at the court house with his 10-ear exhibit by 11:30 a. m.

Those boys who made not less than 75 bushels of corn at a cost of less than 30 cents a bushel are wanted to enter the contest in the National Corn Exposition at St Louis in December, and they should take especial care of their exhibits, reports and history.

The prizes to be awarded are as follows:

- First prize—\$40 in gold.
 - Second prize—\$25 in gold.
 - Third prize—Tool chest on exhibition at Kingstree Hardware Co's store.
 - Fourth prize—Set of selected tools costing \$10; or saddle, saddle blanket and bridle.
 - Fifth prize—Monogram stick pin; or No 14 Waterman fountain pen with gold bands, either costing \$5.
 - 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 10th prizes—Boys' selection of No 12 Waterman fountain pen worth \$2.75; or riding bridle and saddle blanket worth the same.
 - 11th, 12th and 13th prizes—A good riding bridle.
 - 14th prize—A year's subscription to The Youth's Companion.
- For each of the others who files his report and makes his exhibit, a good pocket knife.
- For the boy who makes the largest yield of corn, \$10. To the boy who makes the cheapest corn, the saddle, bridle and blanket, or the set of tools named above.

Lake City News Notes.

Lake City, October 19:—Mrs Ella F Jones is visiting her daughter, Mrs Beatrice Prather at Juliet, Fla. Miss Pauline Woodley came down from Cartersville, where she is teaching, and spent Saturday and Sunday in town.

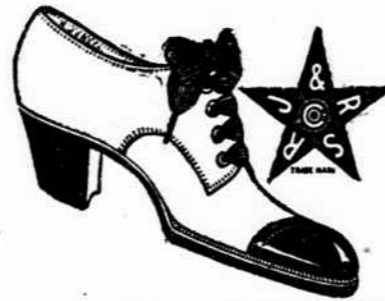
