THE WINSTON-SALEM SOUTHBOUND.

Important New Railroad Connections for Kingstree.

On May 1 the Winston-Salem Southbound Railway, ninety miles in length, in connection with the Atlantic Coast Line inaugurated through train service between Winston-Salem, N C, and Florence, S C, where close connections are made to and from Kingstree and thereby opening up an entirely new territory already having twenty towns and regular stations with this section.

The train leaving Kingstree at 7:42 a. m. daily and reaching Florence at 9:00 a. m. connects with the new train leaving there at 10:00 a. m. daily and arriving Darlington 10:25 a. m., Cheraw, 11:43 a. m., Wadesboro 12:42 noon, Lexington 4:09 p. m. and Winston-Salem 5:15 p. m.
