THE TOWN OF HEMINGWAY.

Bright Future Forecasted When Railroad is Completed.

Florence, November 17:—The South Carolina Western (Seaboard) railroad is now nearly ready for the rails and ties. The trestle and bridge over the Pee Dee river is now being built. Work is being done on both ends of the trestle, which will be a mile and a quarter in length.

The road from Andrews to Hemingway, the settlement that used to be known as Lambert's, is in operation, and that is eight miles from Allison.

The contracting force expects to return to the Florence extension as soon as the grading from Hartsville to Sumter and Timraonsville is completed.

This will not be a great while with the way that the Seaboard people push their grading. It is said that the difficulty in getting labor is the main reason that the work on this end of the road is not being pushed now. The contractors say that they could use six times as many men as they have if they could get them, and they are paying big wages for those they have. Labor is scarce in this country, and the farmers are still crying for people to help pick cotton.

It is estimated that the grading of the road from Florence to Allison will be so light that it can be rushed through in a hurry when the big bridge is finished.

There is going to be a big town at Hemingway, where a number of lots were sold recently. The big station on the new road, however, is going to be at Allison's landing, in Florence county, where the road forks, and where it crosses the river. There will be wharves built there for the accommodation of river freight and the trains and the boats will probably be run in connection with each other, and the people up and down the river get a good service, and one that they can depend on.

The disposition of the new road to encourage truck growing has appealed to the people of this section very strongly. All of the country through which the extension will run is a natural truck garden, and it will be developed as soon as the farmers are given the facilities for getting it to market.

THE DEADLY BANANA PEEL.

Resident of Greenville a Helpless Invalid for Life Therefrom.

Apropos our remarks recently anent keeping the streets clean, especially of banana peelings and such like, the following article from the Greenville Piedmont is timely and appropriate:

A resident of the city will probably be a helpless invalid for life as a result of slipping on a banana peeling and falling. The doctors report that he will most probably never be able to walk again and there is a possibility that he will in other ways be helpless.

This calls to mind the fact that the ordinance against throwing banana peelings and other trash on the sidewalks is not as strictly enforced as it should be. The wonder is that there have not been more accidents of this kind and we are afraid that there will be in the future unless precautions are taken.

In the enforcement of this law the police should have the aid of good citizens. It is very difficult to catch the offenders unless this is the case. If you see a man throwing a banana peeling or any other rubbish on the sidewalk, call a cop and tell him about it. In doing this you may be taking a step which will save some person a broken limb. If you had done this in the past that poor man would probably not now be in the hospital a helpless invalid.

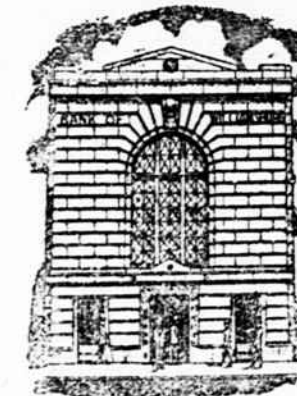
