AN ORDINANCE to Prohibit the Wandering, Roaming and Running at Large of Stock or Other Animals upon the Streets of Kingstree, S C, and to Provide a Punishment for Violation of This Ordinance.

Be It Ordained by the Mayor and Al ermen of the Town of Kingstree. S C n Council Assembled and by Authority

1. That from and after the passage and ratification of this Ordinance, it shall be unlawful for the owner of any
