AFFAIRS AT ANDREWS.

Snow Eight Inches Deep--A Disquisition on Sabbath-Breaking.

Andrews, February 15:—Our town is to-day enveloped in the second snow, this time being eight inches on a level. It is one of the heaviest snows ever known in this county and the old folks say this is a forerunner of a good crop year. We hope the old saying may be true.

Just about half the farmers in this locality have abandoned their farms and gone to the public works of the county, therefore it is impossible to raise over half a crop in this community, and not a single sack of fertilizer has been bought here. Moreover, I don't think that there will be ten per cent of 1911's crop.

Our honorable city fathers have passed an ordinance prohibiting the merchants from selling on the Sabbath, but only make selling goods Sabbath-breaking; they do not prohibit any class of labor being performed. This is another case of reaching around the people at their own doors to take some one by the hair of the head a mile away. Make the ordinance to prohibit Sabbath-breaking of every nature. You can hear the ring of the machine hammer and the roaring of machinery every Sabbath in this town and the workmen going out on Sunday. These works are located in the town. Is not this Sabbath-breaking? All Sabbath-breaking is a violation of our common law. See the winking of one eye and say, "We will make you observe the law, but the other half do as they see fit." Is not this monarchical government? See it as you please, but this is the condition of this town. The constitutions of the United States and the State of South Carolina grant equal rights to all men and special privileges to none.

I said a few weeks ago in the columns of The Record that this town would soon make an attempt to make an amendment to the constitution of South Carolina without a vote; now it really looks that way, when they make only one kind of Sabbath-breaking a crime. Our people are determined to report to the intendant of our town every Sabbath-breaking, whether by labor or otherwise, and demand trial for the same. We want this law carried out to the letter. Our people say if the town does not enforce the law, the State will, and steps will be taken to deal justice by law to every one who breaks the law in this town. The people of the town have been moved on this subject and a stop will be put to Sabbath-breaking, regardless of whom shall be hurt. The laws forbid Sabbath-breaking; let all business men, corporations, associations and individuals abide the same law. W S C.
