

TOBACCO SOLD MONTH OF SEPTEMBER.

THIRTEEN MARKETS AND THIRTY-THREE WAREHOUSES REPRESENTED IN REPORT.

Columbia, October 23:—The South Carolina tobacco report for the month of September was issued late yesterday afternoon by Commissioner Watson, showing that the amount of tobacco sold in this State for the months of July, August and September this year was 24,337,912 pounds, and valued at \$2,653,443.68, as against 11,077,917 pounds, valued at \$1,303,290.28, for the same period last year. The increase alone this year in money received by tobacco growers during the months of July, August and September as compared with the same months of 1911 is very nearly equal to the total money value of the entire 1911 crop.
