





The office of the Supervisor of Reg istration will be open on the 1st Mon day in each month for the purpose of registering any person who is qualified as follows: Who shall have been a resident of the State for two years, and of the county one year, and of the polling pre-cinct in which the elector offers to vote four months before the day of election, and shall have paid, six months before, any poll tax then due and payable, and who can both read and write any section of the constitu-tion of 1895 submitted to him by the Supervisors of Registration, or who can show that he owns, a 1 has paid all taxes collectable on during the present year, property in this State assessed at three hundred dollars or more.


