



STATE and GENERAL TOPICS

The State Fair at Columbia opened Monday.

Engineer Ben J Voyle was killed and five persons injured Monday afternoon when a Southern railway train jumped the track near Easley.

McKeiver's sash, door and blind factory at Sumter was destroyed by fire Sunday morning, the loss being estimated at \$30,000, with only \$4,000 insurance.

Sam McGowan of South Carolina has been made pay inspector of the Asiatic fleet comprising nine men-of-war and a combined crew of about 10,000 sailors.

John H Seife, a conductor of the Charleston Terminal Co, was instantly killed Friday night in Charleston by being ground to pieces by the train he was in charge of.

Eugene Saxon was killed last Thursday near Catechee, in Pickens county. J H McAllister is charged with the killing. Reports state that the two were gambling. Saxon was shot with a pistol.

Louis G McCall of Darlington killed himself Thursday night of last week. Ill health is the supposed cause of the suicide. He was a member of one of Darlington county's oldest families.

Wednesday of last week the body of Mrs Mary E McInerney, an aged Charleston lady, was found at the bottom of the cistern into which she had fallen the night before through the broken trap door.

Sheriff John D Owens and deputies of Laurens county, in attempting to arrest Lace Glover, a negro, and his two boys, charged with burning a barn, were forced to kill Glover Monday morning at the negro's cabin, where they went to serve the warrant.

Ernest and Hunt Sharp, brothers, aged 21 and 18, respectively, were shot and killed Monday near Barksdale, in Laurens county, by Cornelius Edwards, aged 21, Hunt's brother-in-law. In the fight Edwards was wounded, but not seriously, and was later carried to jail by Rural Policeman Columbus Owens. The killing is said to have been the result of a family feud growing out of Hunt's marrying Edwards' sister.

Spectator in Court Room Strikes Deputy Causing Pistol to Fire.

Anderson, October 23:—As Deputy Sheriff Sanders was escorting Judge Hayne F Rice of Aiken, presiding over court here, through the court house to a hotel for dinner recess today, a friend struck the officer with a stick, causing the officer's pistol to be discharged. The bullet tore the seat of Sanders' trousers, struck the tiled floor, glanced and buried itself in a window jam. The incident caused some excitement as the corridor of the court house was crowded at the time. While Deputy Sanders was remonstrating with the man who dealt the blow Judge Rice remarked characteristically that the man "had acted very foolishly." The bullet harmed no one. The blow causing the discharge of the pistol was dealt in a friendly way and the man dealing the blow was as much surprised as anybody when the pistol fired.
