Hard Times a Myth?

A few days ago a local attorney told us that he had \$20,000 to lend for a client but that he could not find any borrowers.

A big insurance company has set aside \$2,000,000 to be loaned in this State at 7%. Dillon county's apportionment is \$100,000. So far the insurance company has not been able to make a loan in this county.

Last week the State of South Carolina borrowed \$600,000 from a national bank in a nearby town at 2.67%. Last year at this time money cost the State 5%.

The last statement of the State Bank Examiner showed that loans in South Carolina had fallen off 30 per cent as compared with a corresponding period for the previous year.

Cheap money does not indicate that the State is making any substantial progress along industrial lines. It is rather the reverse. However, it shows that our fears last fall were not well founded. Our people are learning how to get along with less money, and bankruptcy is further away today than it has been in many years.—Dillon Herald.

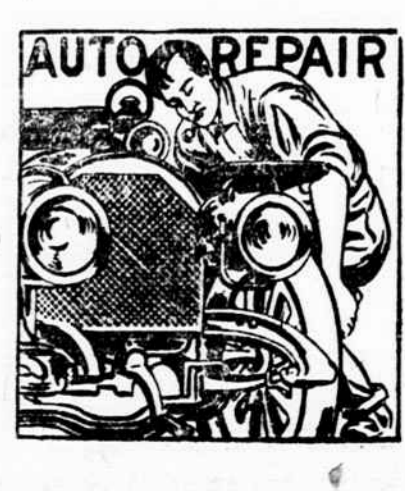
