publicans Gain Ground.

The most distinctive results of the State election held Tuesday in a number of the States is the overwhelming defeat of woman suffrage in every State where the question was a feature of the election.

In New York the majority against it was 175,000.

In Massachusetts woman suffrage was defeated by 132,082 votes. In Pennsylvania it was also defeated by a heavy majority.

In Ohio State-wide prohibition was defeated by a majority estimated, on almost complete returns, from 30.000 to 40.000.

Massachusetts: Samuel W McCall, Republican, defeated David I Walsh, Democrat, for Governor by a plurality of 6,606. Republicans gained one in the Senate and sixteen in the House, both of which they control. Maryland: Emerson C Harrington, Democrat, defeated Ovington R Weller, Republican, for Governor by a plurality of 3,504. Democrats resembly.


