

**Pretty Good Law.**

In Virginia two weeks ago Judge Holt imposed a fine of \$75.00 upon Carl Taylor, a young white man who plead guilty in the circuit court to indictments charging him with furnishing and delivering ardent spirits to a minor.

"From what the court can learn of the case there is no evidence of any criminal intent on the part of the accused. The court would impose a fine of seventy-five dollars on the one indictment; and, in view of the fact that he had plead guilty on this indictment no action would be taken on the other at this time, but it would be retained on the docket and if there was no further violation of law it would be dismissed; in case of further violation he would be prosecuted."

Young Taylor was depot and express agent at Decatur, Va, and it was not contended that he was trafficking in spirituous liquors. The case is noteworthy from the fact that he, as agent of an express company, delivered to a minor an express package containing liquor. He delivered the package to the minor on an order signed by a man of the Decatur community in whose name the package had been received by the express agent from a liquor house at Harrisonburg.

The above may seem to be pretty strict law, but it is law, nevertheless, and if we mistake not, the provisions of the two-quart-a-month act provides against the delivery of packages containing liquor to any except to whom the same is addressed and then only upon his or her signature indicating receipt in person of the package. It will be well for express agents in this section to accept no written orders for the delivery of liquor whether presented for a minor or adult.

**Turned Over the Coffin.**

The Greenville News of Sunday prints the following story:

A very unusual accident happened yesterday afternoon at the American Spinning company village, which caused a great deal of excitement in that community. There were a number of people gathered at the funeral of John Briddell, well known among the mill villagers. While the services were being held over the body, a son of the deceased, who it is said was intoxicated, got into an argument with another member of the family, and soon the two began to scuffle. Other members of the family interposed and the fight became a melee.

In the scuffle and excitement the coffin which contained the dead man was turned over upon the floor. Numbers of people rushed to the scene of the conflict. Sheriff Rector was phoned to come at once to the scene, and when he arrived the coffin was spilled upon the floor. He arrested the son, Monday, and lodged him in the county jail. The morgue was restored to its position and the remainder of the service completed.

**To Repair Stock Law Fence.**

**SPECIFICATIONS.**

All posts must be 6 feet long, of long pine heart, not less than 4 inches in diameter, dug or driven in ground 18 inches 10 feet apart, 1 strand good galvanized barbed wire 3 inches from ground; 2 inches above galvanized barbed wire, 26-inch galvanized wire, 6 inch mesh; above the 26-inch field wire, 2 strands of good barbed wire; must be placed 4 and 6 inches apart, respectively. 
