DESTRUCTIVE FIRE AT LEXINGTON.

TARIVING TOWN PRACTICALLY WIPED OUT BY FLAMES--LOSS ESTIMATED AT \$160,000.

A special dispatch to the News and Courier Tuesday morning from Lexington states:

Lexington was destroyed by a fire, night, doing an estimated damage of \$160,000, wiping out every business house in town except the Caughman-Kaminer Company, the Harmon Drug Company and Meetze & Son. The Home National Bank, on the corner of Main and Depot streets; the court house and the county jail were also saved by heroic efforts.

The fire originated in the store of the Sawyer Drug Company and was quickly swept by a northwest wind to adjoining buildings on each side.

The following buildings were consumed: Scott Hendrix, two stores; the old W P Roof building, which was unoccupied, except by a barber shop; Mitchell's meat market, a small shoe repairing establishment, Barley Barre Hardware Company, E B Roof & Sons, Andrew J Mathias, Sawyer Drug Company, E G Dreher, Enterprise Hardware Company, Sar-
