BOYS' CORN CLUB DEPARTMENT.

Separate entries will be required in each of the above classes, in other words, a boy cannot enter ten ears in Class A and contest in class B with the same corn. In order to enter both classes he must have two exhibits of ten ears. His single ear entry for Class C must also be separate and independent of entries in Class A and B. Corn should be carefully selected and each ear wrapped in paper and the exhibit packed in tight box.
