Table of Poultry Department exhibits including No fowls can be removed until after 4 p. m. Friday, and The Expert Judge will confine the awards strictly to those laid down in the premium list.

3 The New American Standard of Perfection will govern in varieties except Pit Games, which will be judged for their pit qualities.

4 In no case will a premium be awarded when a specimen does not score 70 points, the first premium bird to score 80 points.

5 Every exhibitor must be the bona fide owner of each and every entry made by him.

6 Where only one entry is exhibited in a class first prize will be awarded, if worthy.

7 The address of exhibitor and prices may be placed on the coop at any time after being judged.

8 All shippers of poultry must plainly mark each coop with owner's name and shipping point, that all may be promptly returned at close of Fair without mistake.

9 Terms: Pen to consist of one male (either cock or cockerel) and four females (either hens or pullets). Cock—a male bird over one year old. Cockerel—a male bird under one year old. Hen—a female bird over one year old. Pullet—a female bird under one year old.

10 Birds entered as pen cannot be entered as single birds.

11 Exhibitors may have their birds cared for and fed by the Society by enclosing 10c for each bird when making entries.

12 No exhibitor shall feed his own birds without consulting the superintendent.

13 All exhibits must be in by Tuesday 1 o'clock p. m., November 7.
