Jacob Moss, Ph D, State chairman of the Red Cross organization, who gave up his chair in the faculty of South Carolina to take up the work, was present and addressed the meeting. Dr Moss's remarks were of a highly entertaining and instructive nature and will be of much assistance to those here interested in the splendid work. An organization was effected and the following chosen as officers: Dr P P Frierson, chairman; Mrs D C Scott, vice chairman; Mrs P O Arrowsmith, secretary; C W Boswell, treasurer.

There will be a meeting of the officers at the residence of Mrs D C Scott tomorrow (Friday) morning at 10 o'clock for the purpose of selecting chairmen for the various committees, and those selected will constitute the executive committee.

NEW COUNTY IS DEFEATED.

ELECTION HELD TUESDAY GOES AGAINST THE JOHN RUTLEDGE COUNTY SUPPORTERS.

In the election held Tuesday for the formation of Rutledge county out of portions of Williamsburg and Florence counties, the new county project was defeated.

Up to the time of going to press we have been unable to get the returns from Florence, but it is understood that the people of both counties living in the territory affected and entitled to express their preferences voted against the proposition.

The Rutledge county proposition has been before the people several times and each time has been defeated. In Lake City, where the sentiment for the new county is strong, only a dozen votes were cast against the project, while more than three hundred favored it. No other precincts in Florence have been heard from definitely, but there is no doubt the Rutledge county supporters have lost their fight by big odds.
