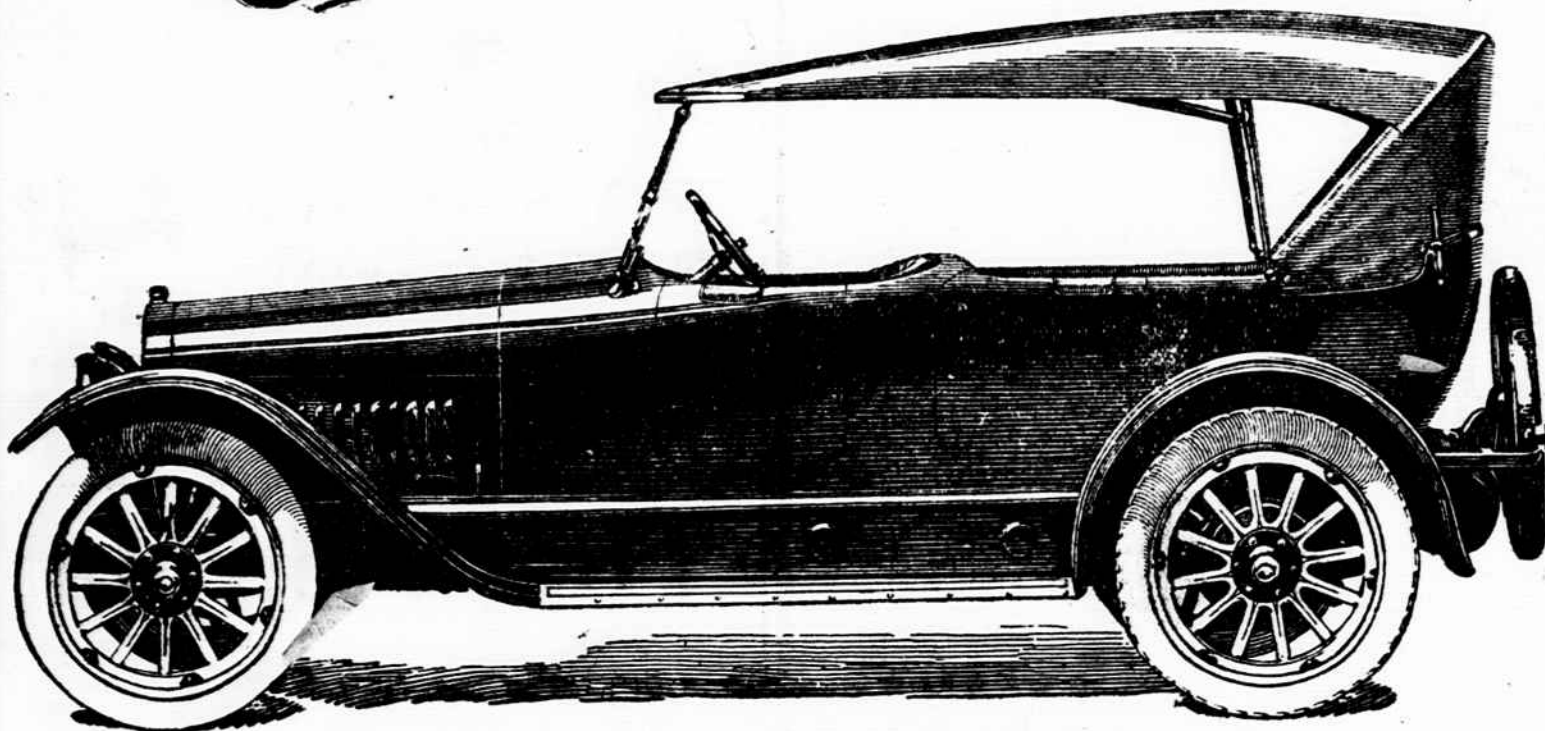

The official endorsement of the Order of the Eastern Star of Georgia enrolling 5,000 women and the guaranteed backing of the order in the Salvation Army Home Service Fund campaign for \$13,000,000 is given by Mrs. Winifred McConnell, Grand Worthy Matron of the Eastern Star, in a statement issued by her just before starting from Savannah on a tour of the state in the interest of the campaign.

"I feel confident in asking for the support of our women in this movement," said Mrs. McConnell, "and it is proper to say at this moment that we are pledging the order of the Eastern Star to contribute to all work of this kind.

"The Salvation Army has done so much good to every community I feel every confidence in pledging the support of my own organization.

"I hope and trust they will all feel the importance of acting promptly and generously. Every community owes a great deal to the Salvation Army and none more than the cities where the influence of their work reaches many cases that are withdrawn from churches and organized charities.

WINTHROP COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP AND ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

The examination for the award of vacant scholarships in Winthrop College and for the admission of new students will be held at the County Court House on Friday, July 4th, at 9 A. M., and also on Saturday, July 5th, at 9 A. M., for those who wish to make up by examinations additional units required for full admission to the Freshman Class of this institution. The examination on Saturday, July 5th, will be used only for making admission units. The scholarships will be awarded upon the examination held on Friday, July 4th. Applicants must not be less than sixteen years of age. When scholarships are vacant, after July 4th, they will be awarded to those making the highest at this examination, provided they meet the conditions governing the award. Applicants for scholarships should write to President Johnson for scholarship examination blanks. These properly filled out by the applicant, should be filed with President Johnson by July 1st.

BURY 25,000 IN FRANCE

Thirty kilometers north of Verdun, near the line where the closing battle of the great war was most fiercely waged, the remains of twenty-five thousand United States soldiers are being assembled in what will be the greatest of our national cemeteries.

Arlington has more than 20,000 graves, Chalmette more than 12,000, Chattanooga more than 13,000, Fredericksburg more than 15,000 and Nashville and Vicksburg more than 16,000 each. Antieham and Gettysburg, ranking among the most sanguinary fields of the Civil war, have cemeteries containing 4,751 and 3,636, respectively.—New York World.
