An exchange, the Dillon Herald, calls attention to an amendment to the school law which might easily be overlooked and cause trouble for Williamsburg parents. The Herald says: "Several thousand South Carolina fathers and mothers are likely to become innocent law breakers after August 15th. "It is not generally known that at the last session of the general assembly the school law was amended by imposing a penalty on parents who neglected to register with the chairman of the board of trustees on or before August 15 the names of their children between the ages of 7 and 14 years. "Failure to comply with the law makes the parent subject to a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$10 or imprisonment for not less than 5 nor more than 10 days. "The law applies to those counties which abolished the office of truant officer, but as this office was abolished in many counties last year, the law is almost state-wide in its application. "If you do not want to come in conflict with the law you had better see that your child's name and age are registered with the chairman of your board of trustees on or before the 15th of this month."
