The total white population of South Carolina is 391,105. Of these, 62,663 are members of the Baptist church; 50,244 are members of the Methodist church; 9,000 belong to the Lutheran church; and 3,500 are members of the A. B. Presbyterian church, making a total of 122,707 actual members in these denominations. If to these be added the children and friends of these churches, the numbers will be swelled about three-fold, giving an actual membership of 365,000 out of the total of 391,105. The four churches named represent a national membership of nearly one-third, and a membership and following of nine-tenths of the entire white population of South Carolina.
