I have often seen volunteer stalks near the end of rows that received no preparation of land or cultivation whatever, well fruited.

The above mode of cultivation is generally practiced by the majority of farmers on plantations of a sandy quality of soil, and the above experiment shows it can be done on any of our lands, if the seasons are anywise uniform. I do not advocate it on the ground of increased acreage being planted, but to lessen somewhat the exgense of labor and horse power.
