The farmers get the paper free for six months being the beneficiaries of a propagandeit fund contributed by zealous prohibitionists. The publishers of the Voice have been astonished lately at the great number of papers rejurned from country postoffices with notice from the post masters that the Voice was not wanted by the farmers to whom it is addressed. 
